Ruth Coffman, Urban Labs: Key Stakeholder

Ruth comes to Urban Labs from Cook County Sheriff's Office, where she started and led the Office's first Research Department . As Research Director she built analytical and data capacity within the Sheriff's Office, provided strategic direction and led evaluations of programs internal operation. Previously, Coffman worked in research capacity in a variety of organizations, including the Center for Global Development and also interned in the Social Office at the White House. She holds two Master Degrees, one in Public Policy from UChicago Harris and has another from Divinity School at the University of Chicago.

Bobbie Ball, Partners in Community Building, Inc.: Key Stakeholder

Bobbie is the founder and Executive Director of Partners in Community Building, Inc. whose mission is to provide and foster safe, sanitary and affordable housing to low-income individuals, families, and seniors, as well as related community focused financial education and human services information. She consults regularly with executives from a variety of fields to help create synergistic solutions to housing and community-impact problems. She is a member of the Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC), her role is that of an advocate of the communities in Chicago for the establishment and maintenance of CDBG government –assisted programs and services that can realistically achieve defined goals and objectives and provide the decision makers with advantage of its first-hand knowledge of community facts, experiences, perceptions, and opinions. Bobbi's volunteering and community services are priorities in her life. She is dedicated to improving the lives of people who are financially challenged in the City of Chicago. Bobbi is currently the treasurer for the CoC Board and is on the CoC Board Executive Committee.

Carrie Thomas, Chicago Jobs Council: Key Stakeholder

Carrie provides oversight and leadership for CJC's program and policy work and represents CJC in various workforce development initiatives at the city, state, and national levels, including the Economic Development Committee of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for planning and the Leadership Council of the National Skill Coalition. Prior to joining CJC Carrie spent ten years advocating on behalf of low-wage, un- and underemployed, and dislocated worker in Minnesota, most recently as Policy Director for St. Paul- based JOBS NOW Coalition. While in Minnesota she served as vice-chair of the Minnesota Job Skills Partnership Board, co-chair of the Board of Directors of Child Care WORKS, and as a member of state's Unemployment Insurance Advisory Committee. After several years working in programs for children and families in Chicago, Carrie attended and graduated in 1997 from Northeastern University School of Law in Boston.

Ray Willis, Department of Housing & Urban Development: Key Stakeholder

Ray Willis currently serves as the Director of Community Planning and Development for Chicago's Office of the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Ray has oversight of one of the Department's largest portfolios of community development programs, currently administering an annual budget in excess of \$1 Billion. Ray leads HUD's Illinois efforts in key program areas including Community and Economic Development, Supportive Housing for the Homeless, Housing Opportunities for Persons with HIV/AIDS, and Disaster Relief. Ray has made numerous contributions at HUD as planner, innovator and manager.

Bobbi Bogan, Bogan Quarters: At-Large Alternate

Established in 1996, Bogan Quarters provides supportive services and housing to homeless Veterans and individuals in recovery from substance abuse. From 2012-2015, she served on the Board of Directors as Secretary and President of Progress Center for Independent Living (PCIL) Forest Park, Illinois. She is a lifelong advocate for protecting, empowering, serving and providing opportunities for the homeless as well as those with physical and mental disabilities. "Ms. Bobbi" (as she affectionately known) has shown her support to both the Chicago CoC and Northwest Indiana CoC respectively.

Renita R White, UCAN: Key Stakeholder Alternate

Renita has worked in social services for more than 30 years she joined UCAN in 2010. Her management experience began as a Vice President at Central Baptist Family Services (now One Hope United), and she has focused on ensuring high-quality programs as Director of Quality Assurance while at the Children's Place Association and her work as a consultant with many agencies across the city and nation. Throughout her career, Ms. White has managed multiple programs throughout Chicago, including in child welfare, case management, mental health, day treatment, counseling, health, workforce development and transitional housing for the homeless. Ms. White has worked with national organizations such as Child Welfare League of America, sitting on a special policy task force to write best practices guidelines for adolescent programs with direct impact on national policy. Ms. White has also served on multiple task forces at the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services. She continues to serve as a Peer Reviewer and Technical Assistant for the Council on Accreditation (COA), which certifies and ensures best practices for child welfare agencies nationwide. Ms. White currently sits on the board for national Health and Human Services membership organization (CHSSM) and holds key roles on a variety of committees through Chicago's homeless network.
