Alicia's commitment to caring for marginalized individuals has remained constant since 1997. Alicia has been a provider of direct services for people living with HIV/AIDS as well as an administrator overseeing HIV prevention, care and education programs. **From 2008-2013, Alicia planned and coordinated federally funded resources for health, housing and ancillary care services for people living with HIV in Cook and the Collar Counties of DuPage, Kendall, Grundy, Will, Kane, Lake and McHenry.** Alicia is currently the Director of Supportive Services at Christian Community Health Center (CCHC) responsible for all ancillary services (permanent supportive housing, interim housing, behavioral health, HIV prevention & care and programming for sex workers). She has attended Chicago Planning Council on Homelessness meetings since her career at CCHC.

Alicia's history with community planning began with the Chicago Area HIV/AIDS Services Planning Council currently referred to as the Chicago Area HIV/AIDS Integrated Services Council. She is the first female to chair the Chicago Area HIV/AIDS Services Planning Council and subsequently chaired that group's Priority Setting Committee for three years. She was then elected Community Co-Chair of the Chicago HIV Prevention Planning Group. **This is significant because Alicia is the first female to have chaired both the HIV Care and Prevention Planning Groups in the city of Chicago.** The same commitment and leadership Alicia brought to HIV services, will be replicated on the SPC Executive Committee.
