Taylor Kiely is Trilogy Behavioral Healthcare's Housing Coordinator and is the lead staff implementing and coordinating Trilogy's Housing First Program. This project is funding through the CoC Bonus Project. In her role, Taylor uses the Central Referral System to place clients in permanent supportive housing. Taylor uses HMIS to track program data and often collaborates with the Center for Housing and Health to initiate outreach to homeless clients. Taylor is extremely active in a number of community housing groups and meetings, including the North of Howard Landlord Meeting and the Williams and Colbert Consent Housing Locator Group. Taylor is always looking for ways to expand her knowledge in Chicago's housing resources. As part of this effort she recently attended the 2014 HUD Peer to Peer Homeless Provider Workshop in Springfield, Illinois. Taylor has done a lot of networking and partnership building related to housing, including meeting with the Lawyers Committee on Better Housing to develop resources, and convening Trilogy's successful Landlord Meet and Greet, in which area landlords received information on the Housing First model and the various subsidies available to homeless individuals. Taylor is extremely skilled at working across departments, programs and agencies. Taylor is very flexible and is always willing to pitch in and help to get things done. Taylor's intelligence, kindness, professionalism, and



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commitment to providing resources to homeless individuals are truly an asset to Trilogy and would be an asset to the Chicago CoC Charter Implementation workgroup.
