CoC Application Review Criteria

Applications will be assessed based on 150 points (plus 6 bonus points).

Higher scoring CoCs have a better chance of being awarded projects ranked in Tier 2, depending on the availability of carryover or recaptured funds to be made available.

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HUD's Strategic Plan

For the FY2013-FY2014 CoC Program Competition, CoC Applications will be evaluated in part based on the extent to which CoCs further the achievement of HUD's goals as articulated in HUD's Strategic Plan and the *Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness (usich.gov)*

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CoC Strategic Planning and Performance Section

HUD will award up to 69 points based upon the CoC's plan for and progress to reduce homelessness and decreasing the number of recurrences of homelessness, with a focus on chronic homelessness

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Required Two-Year Plans

This year, HUD has required CoCs to set two-year targets for the following objectives:

- **Ending Chronic Homelessness by 2015** (16 points)
- **Housing Stability** (10 points)
- **Jobs and Income Growth** (8 points)
- **Mainstream Benefits** (7 points)
- **Rapid Re-Housing** (10 points)

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Two-Year Plan Advisory Group

On December 26th, the Alliance sent a request for various stakeholders to participate in a Two-Year Plan Advisory Group.

The Advisory Group met to discuss the two year plans and the following targets are the results of this groups work.

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Objective 1: Increase Progress Towards Ending Chronic Homelessness

HUD states that creating new dedicated PSH beds is only one way to increase progress towards ending homelessness for chronically homeless persons.

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Objective 3: Increase Project Participants Income

HUD states that assisting program participants to increase income is one way to ensure housing stability and decrease the potential of returning to homelessness.

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Objective 3: Increase Participants Income

3A-3.2a Enter the percentage of participants in all COC-funded projects that increased their income from employment from entry date to program exit?	9%	20%	20%

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Objective 4: Increase the Number of Participants Obtaining Mainstream Benefits

HUD states that assisting program participants to obtain mainstream benefits is one way to ensure housing stability and decrease the potential of returning to homelessness.
